Tyne and Wear Branch seminar

This seminar looks at what you need to know to run events safely, from managing crowds effectively to liaising with the emergency services and contingency planning. It will also look at the lessons learnt from the Dreamspace tragedy.

Pam Waldron, Head of Operations for HSE's Field Operations Directorate in the North East, will expand on her article in July's *SHP* about the Dreamspace incident and subsequent trial. She will explain the circumstances that led to the inflatable artwork becoming airborne, the failures of those involved, including the competence issues that the case highlighted, and the lessons for those organising public events.

Neil Malkin, Senior Investigating Officer for Durham Constabulary, led the Dreamspace investigation and has worked closely with the HSE in the application of the Work-related Deaths Protocol in a number of cases. He will accompany Pam for the first part of the seminar as they work through the implications of a corporate manslaughter investigation.

Cameron Adam is the HSE's new Head of Commercial and Consumer Services and Entertainment and Leisure Section. He will provide an overview of the UK event safety scene.

Adrian Tinson, who is leading the review of HSG195 (the Purple Guide), will also give an update on this significant piece of events guidance.

Jon Wort from Resilient Consultants, experts in crowd control and course facilitators at Easingwold Emergency Planning College, will talk about the theories of crowd dynamics and give practical examples of how to prevent crowd issues at your events.

Northumbria Police play a major proactive role in promoting safety in the North East, at events ranging from football matches to the Sunderland International Air Show. Today Superintendent **Derek Scott** will give an insight into major event control from overall strategy to practical implementation (Gold, Silver and Bronze Command). He will also explain how event managers can use event profile intelligence to their advantage and will give examples of how to include contingency planning in your current event safety strategy. The benefits of 'table top' exercises as a vital tool for the event organiser will also be explained.

Ken Scott is author of the Event Safety Guide and Chair of the Safety Advisory Group (SAG) for Sunderland Association Football Club and the Stadium of Light. In this capacity, he's been involved in managing major music concerts such as Take That, Oasis and the forthcoming Pink tour. Ken will detail the processes that the group goes through to prepare for major concerts and the football season and how this evolutionary process is constantly being reviewed and improved.
